### **Overview of the Awards and Nomination Process**

#### **Executive Summary**

## **Judging and criteria**

The ACSA Board decides on the Awards. One or more awards may be made each year.

The merits of each nomination will be judged on the level, frequency and quality of contribution to industry activities, including working groups, over the prior 12 months (that is, calendar year 2011).

## **Notification**

Nominees who are successful (and their nominator) will be notified by 5 February 2012

## **Presentation**

Presentation of the ACSA Award will be made at the Conference Dinner to be held in Sydney on 16 February 2012.
